Cruachan Aí Heritage Centre
Tulsk, Co. Roscommon



Cruachan Aí Heritage Centre interprets one of the most important and best preserved Celtic Royal Sites in Europe. There are sixty national monuments within a four mile radius of Tulsk, which incorporate ring barrows, ring forts, standing stones, caves and an ogham stone. The central monument is Rathcroghan, the pre-historic capital of Connacht, now identified as a ceremonial site associated with pre-Christian ritual.

It is believed that Cruachan was a royal palace and home of the legendary Queen Medb (or Maeve), Earth Goddess and Warrior Queen, who launched the famous cattle raid of Cooley as recounted in 'Táin Bó Cuailnge'. Within the complex lies the Cave of Cruachain, believed to be the mythical entrance into the 'Otherworld'.

The Arigna area has a long tradition of mining which dates back to the 1600s when Charles Coote established iron works at Crevelea and Arigna. Charcoal, made from local timber, was used in the smelting process; however, as local timber supplies reduced, it was necessary to find an alternative fuel. It was through this search that coal was discovered in the area. In 1788 the O'Reilly brothers founded an iron foundry where, for the first time in Ireland, coal was used in the smelting process.

Coal Mining was carried out in Arigna for over 400 years, all mining ceased in 1990 and one tunnel was developed into a visitor centre. With an ex-miner as your tour guide you will get an insight into a working way of life which you could only imagine. Relax in our coffee shop and enjoy the breathtaking view over Lough Allen.

Glendeer Pet Farm is a 6 acre open farm with over 50 species of animals and birds, ranging from Llama, emu, ostrich, deer, Vietnamese pot belly pigs, Jacob sheep, goats, donkeys, Scottish highland heifer, jersey cows, ponies, rabbits, guinea-pigs, puppies etc. We also have pea fowl, Chinese pheasants, and other rare birds and fowl, a coffee shop where we serve light refreshments, a playground with swings, slides, glider swings, and sea-saws, indoor and out door picnic areas, nature walk, and a restored 18 century cottage. Each child receives a little bag of food to feed the animals as they make their way around the farm. Groups catered for by appointment with a guided tour, so very suitable for school tours, scouts, families etc.

Visit the wonderful Strokestown Park House a fully furnished Georgian Mansion and see Irelands last remaining Galleried Kitchen. Tarmon Harbour, Tarmonbarry Village, Co. Roscommon is a landmark marina and tourist development on the banks of the river Shannon. The village is named for St. Barry (St. Berach) of Glendalough who established a monastic settlement here in the 6th century of which some ruins are still evident at nearby Kilbarry. Tarmon Harbour is situated immediately to the south of the picturesque village of Tarmonbarry on the Roscommon / Longford border and along the banks of the beautiful river Shannon. The village is known as the Gateway to the West of Ireland. Tarmon Harbour is a magnificent new residential marina development.
